User's Manual



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Safety Precautions

1. Read these safety instructions carefully.
2. Keep this user's manual for later reference.
3. Disconnect this equipment from any AC outlet before cleaning. Use a damp cloth. Do not use liquid or spray detergents for cleaning.
4. For plug-in equipment, the power outlet socket must be located near the equipment and must be easily accessible.

Chapter 1. Product Introduction

VX-601 is a 12.4” in-vehicle terminal with 700/1200nits brightness display and is flexible to support a wide range of wireless connection capability. The device is well-suited for warehouse management, harbor management, asset management applications. VX-601’s optimized power system is designed for cold cranking, load dump, transient voltage and ESD. The device is engineered with IP66 protection rating, a wide temperature design, wide input range, and rich expanding interfaces that support in-vehicle connectivity.

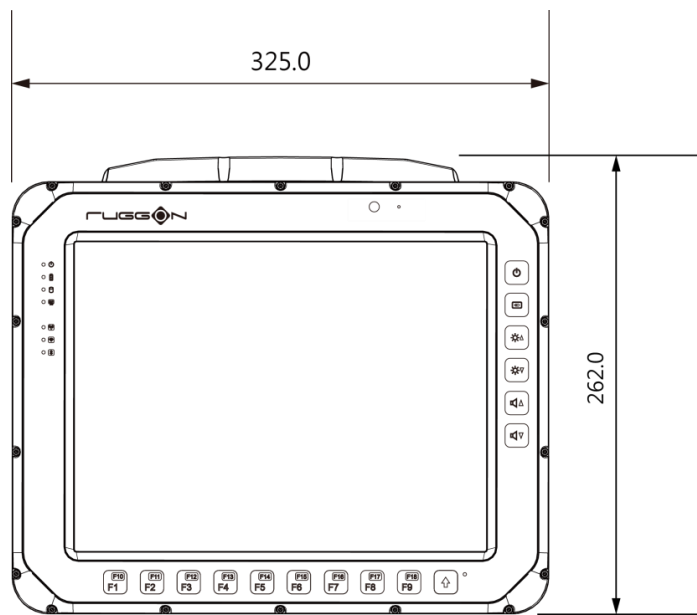

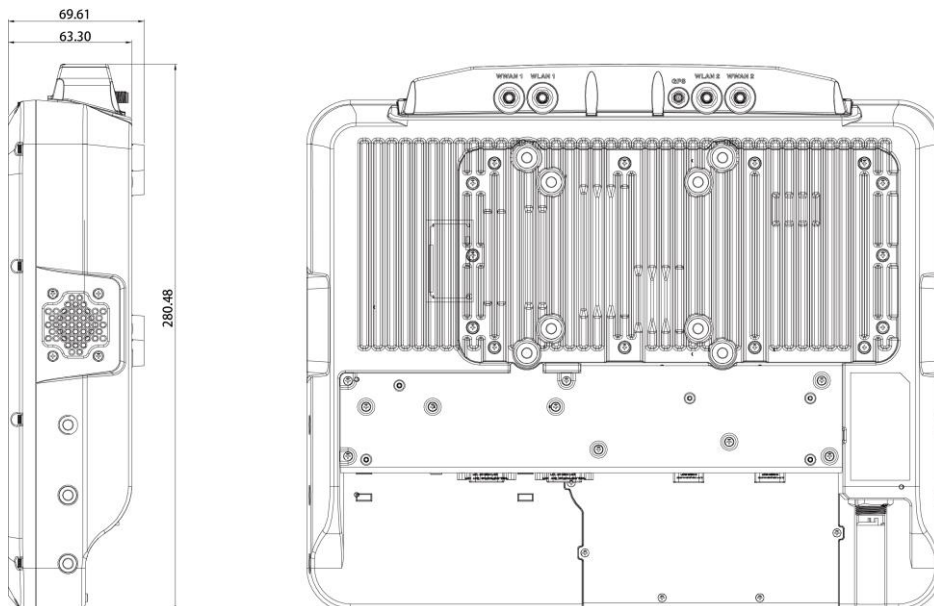

Side View Dimension



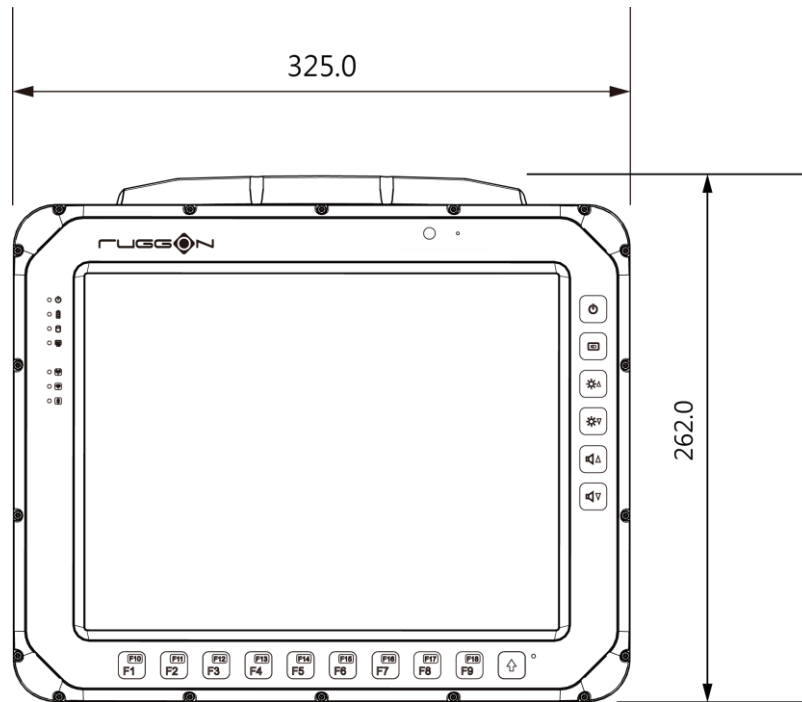

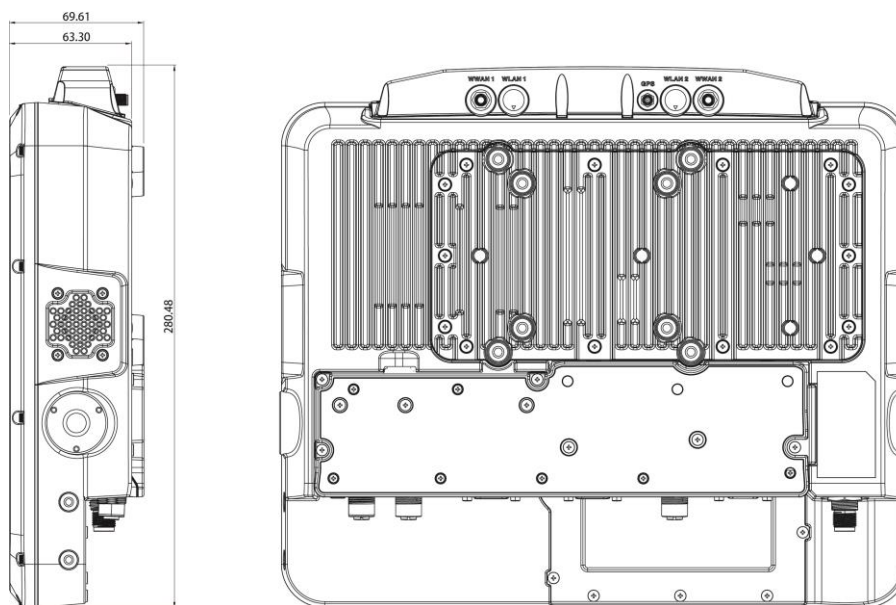

Side View Dimension



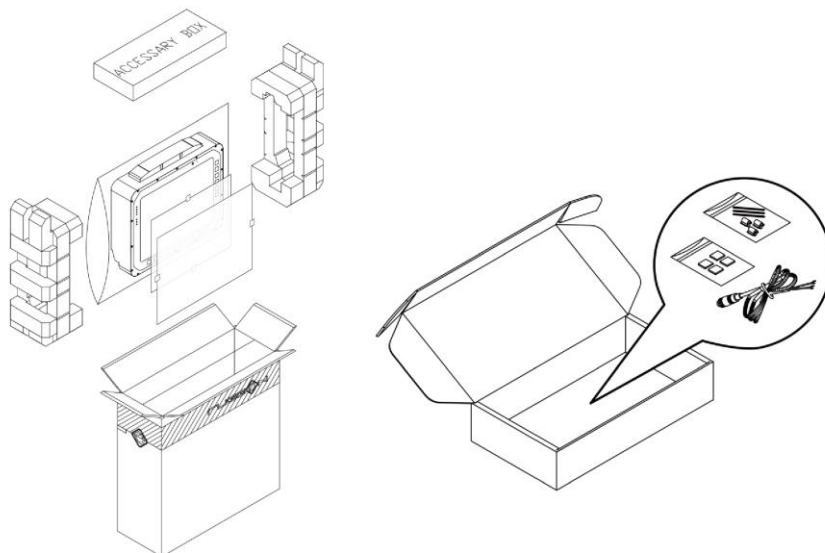

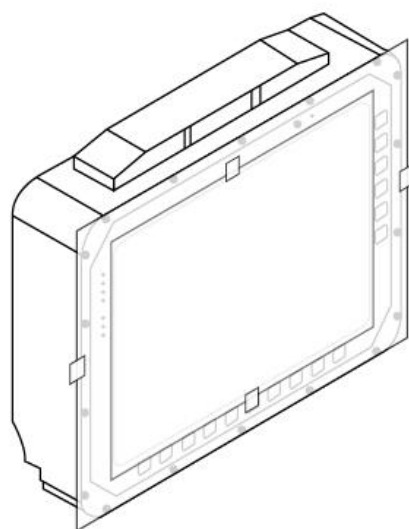
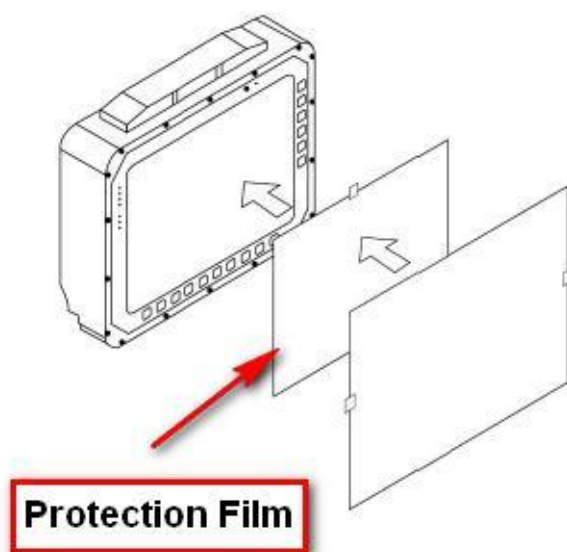

NOTE: The packaging material has been selected to optimally protect your device. After unpacking, store the original packaging material in the event that you need to return for shipment.



The protection film is placed on the product screen in the package. You can use it to increase touch screen durability and protection from scratching, etching, and damage. Designed with a low-tack adhesive, the protection film is easy to apply and remove. It is also engineered to be touch-sensitive and won't affect touch or swipe functions. You can choose whether you want to paste it onto the touch screen or not.

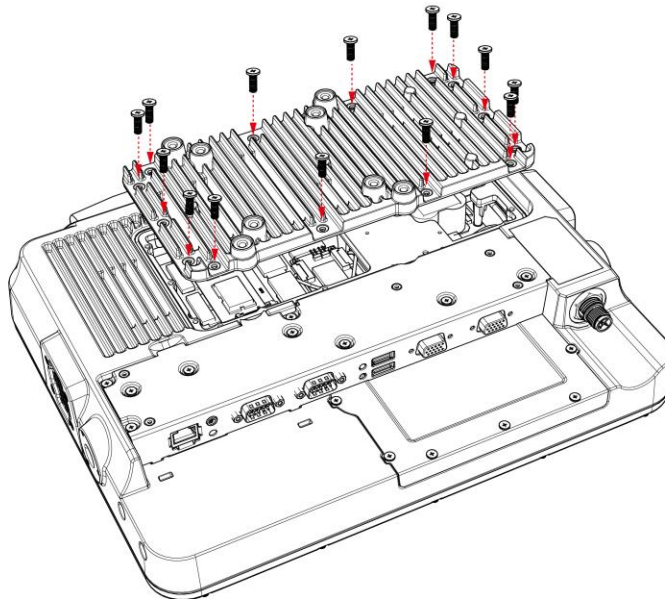
M.2 Module

Prevention of EMI interference in this device is not guaranteed if the original components are replaced.

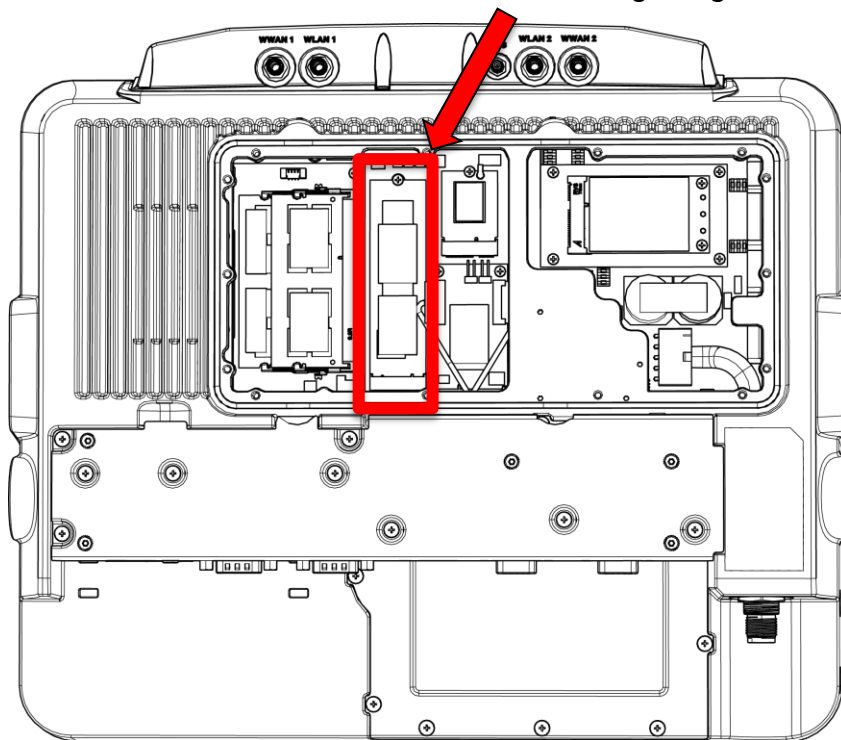
A single M.2 2280 module slot is available for memory expansion. The device supports up to 256GB.

Installing/Removing a M.2 Module

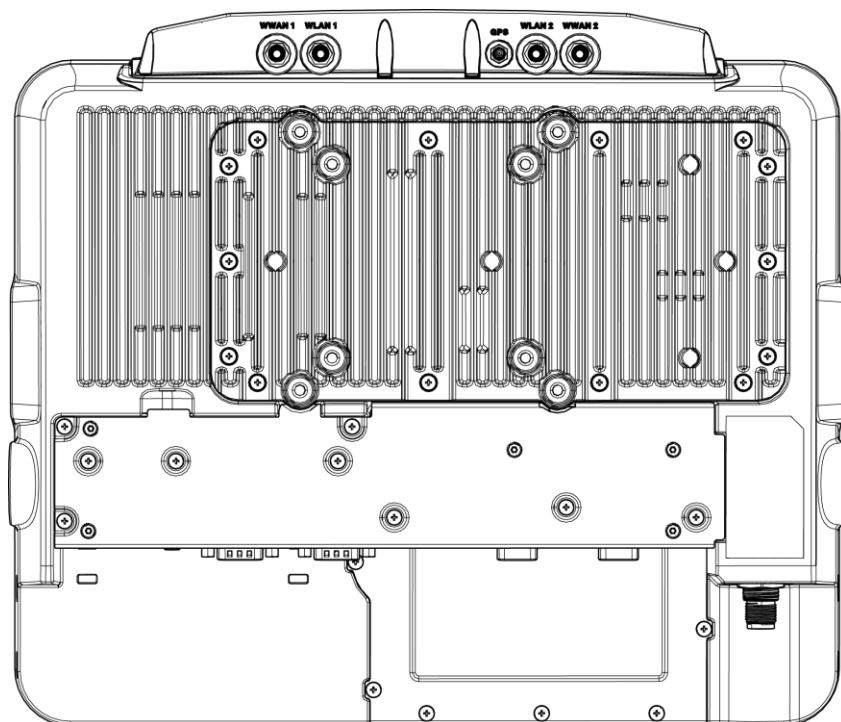
1. Shut down the system properly and disconnect the device from all power sources.
2. Un-mount the device from the mounting apparatus; make sure that the display surface is protected.
3. Remove the screws and the service cover.



4. Locate the M.2 module slot; see the following image.

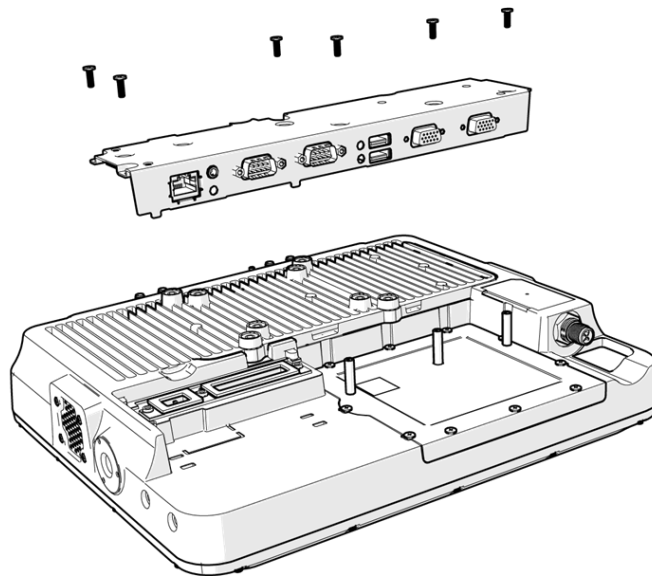


5. Insert the M.2 module into the slot and then fasten the screws or loosen the screws to remove the card
6. Replace the service cover.

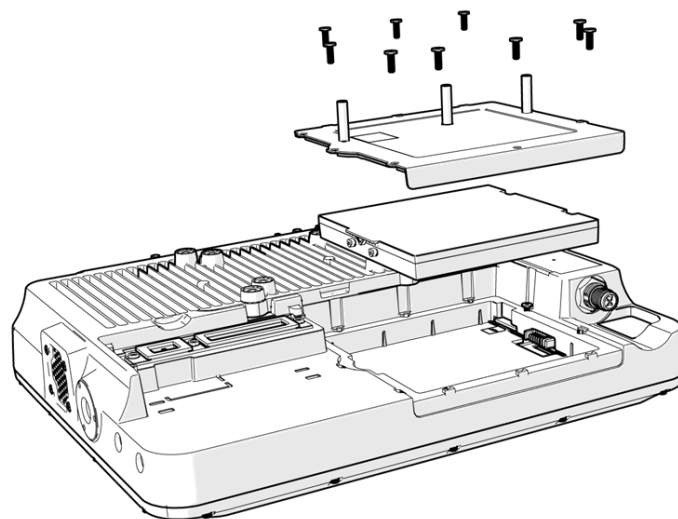


Accessing the SD card

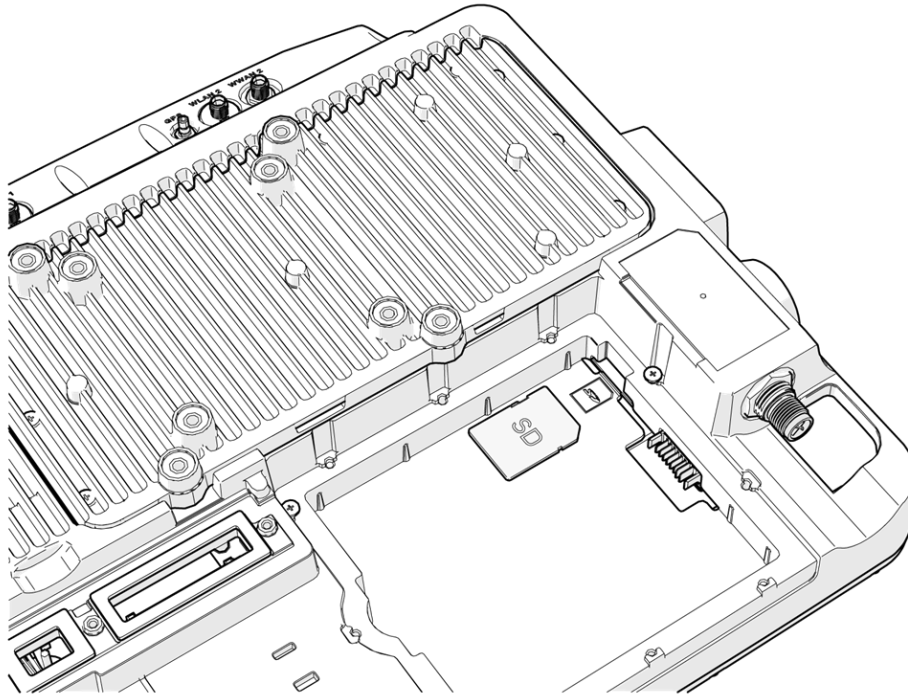
1. Remove the screws to open IO Module.

3. Insert the SD card (Please refer to the image below for the placement position)

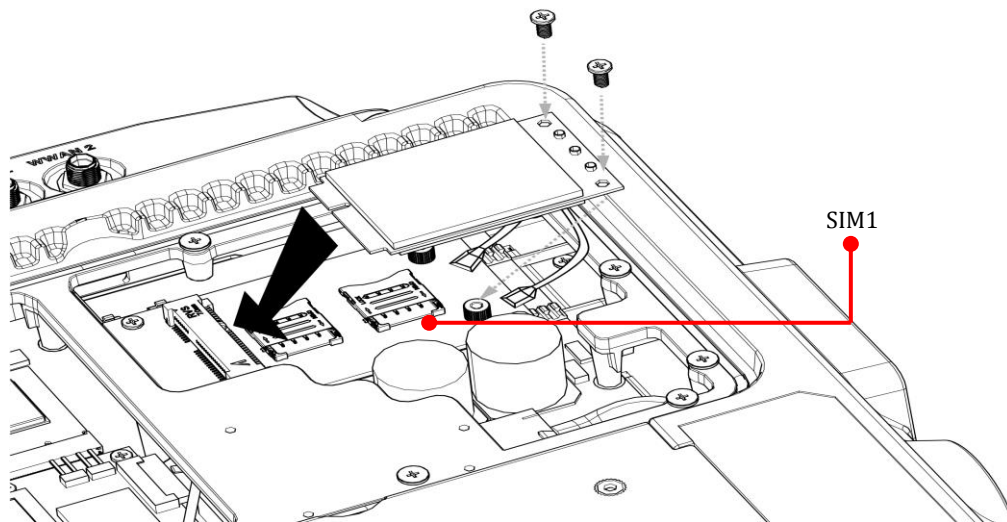


Installing/Removing the SIM card

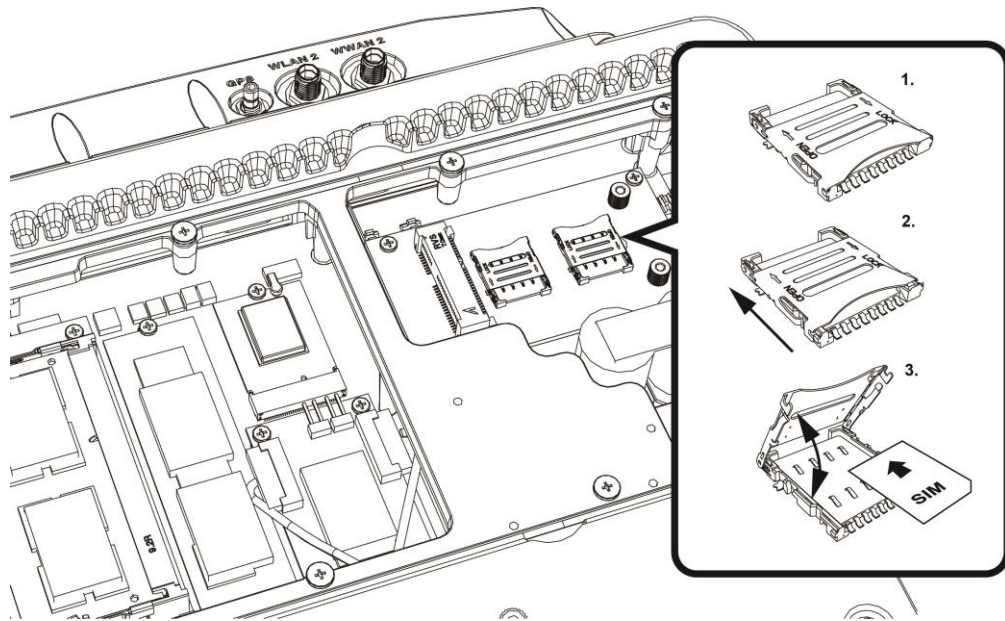
VX-601 provides dual micro SIM slots which are located inside the service door. Install your SIM card in SIM 1 slot or SIM 2 slot. You can select from the two SIM slots via the SIM slot assignment option in DashON interface. The factory default is SIM 1 slot. Please see the following guidelines to install or remove your SIM card.

Internal SIM slot

1. Shut down the system properly and disconnect the device from all power sources.
2. Un-mount the device from the mounting apparatus; make sure that the display surface is protected.
3. Remove the screws securing the cover and remove the cover.
4. Once the service cover is removed, you can see the micro SIM card slot.



5. Slide to unlock the lock on the locking lid.
6. Lift the locking lid up and insert your SIM card.
7. Lock the locking lid back after insertion.

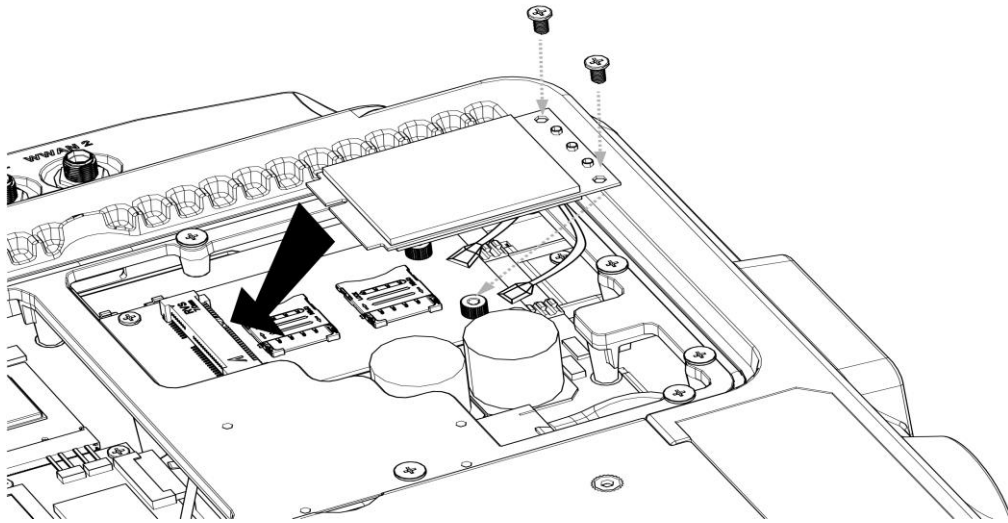


8. Turn your SIM card to the angled corner of your SIM card to match the angled corner of the SIM card holder.
9. Insert the SIM card into the SIM card holder.
10. Close the cover of the SIM card holder.

Installing/Removing the WWAN module

WWAN card slot is also located on the rear side; it is up to the Wi-Fi module. Please read through the following introduction to install or remove the module

1. Power down the device and disconnect it from all power source.
2. Un-mount the device from the mounting apparatus; make sure that the display surface is protected.
3. Open the service cover; locate the WWAN module slot on the VX-601.



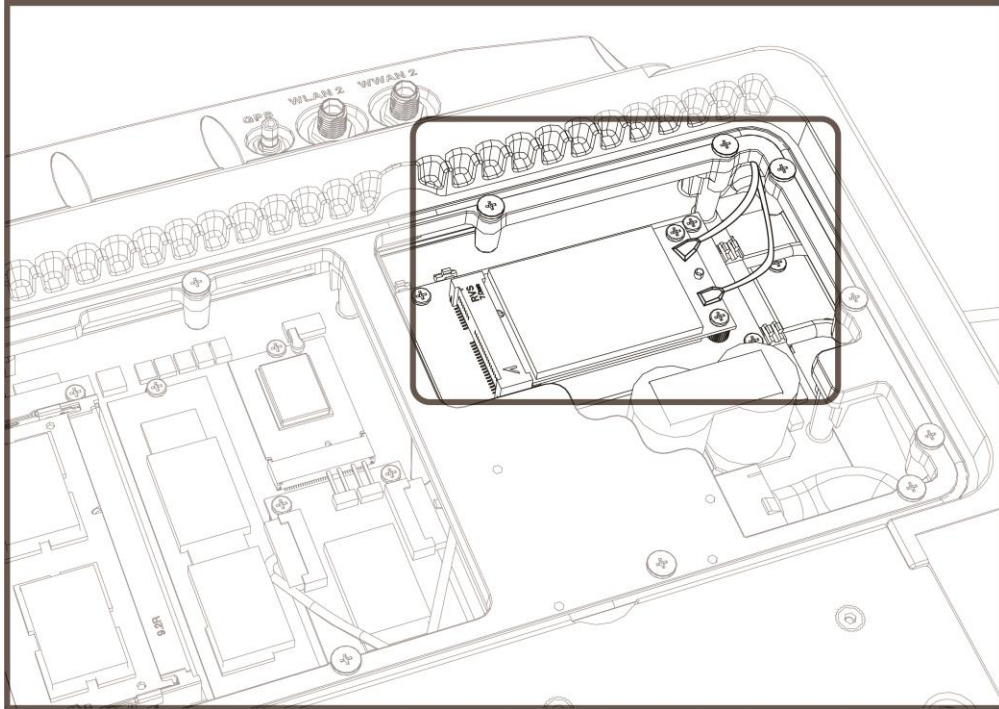

Installing WWAN Antennas

After you installed the WWAN module, you need to connect the antenna for use. Please note VX-601 supports internal (optional) or external WWAN antenna. If you would like to use the internal or external WWAN antenna, you need to manually disable either one of them. The following section will guide you through how to change your internal/ external antenna.

External Antennas

1. Locate the antenna cables. (black cable & grey cable)
2. Use the black antenna cable to connect to the connector labeled **MAIN**. Use the grey antenna cable to connect to the connector labeled **AUX**.

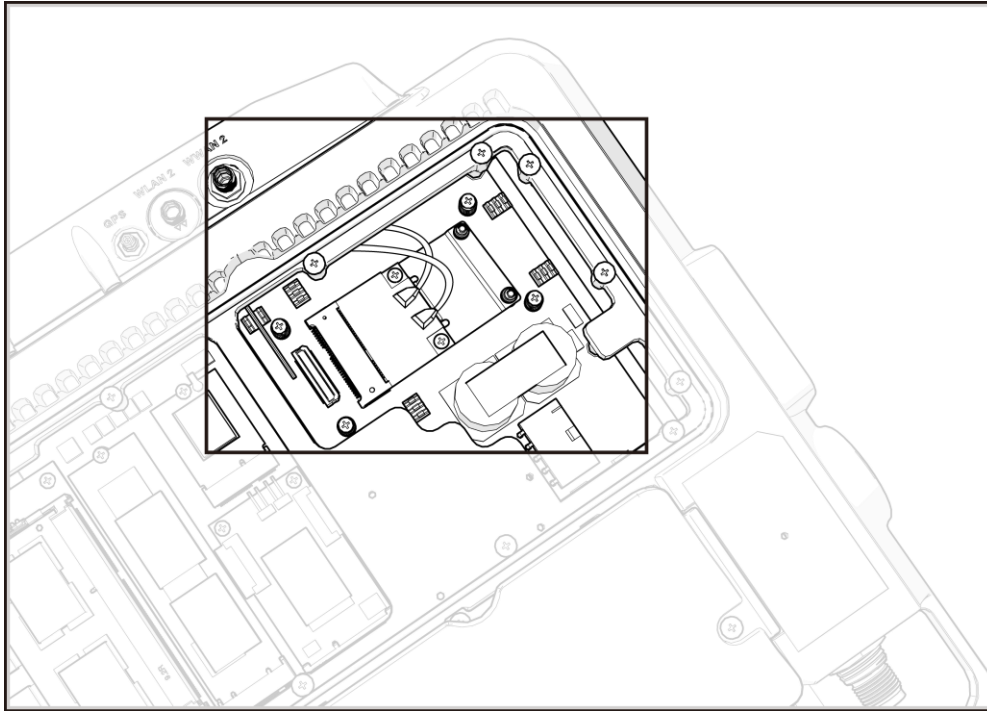


Installing WLAN Antennas

VX-601 supports WLAN internal and external antennas connections, and the default is internal; if you would like to connect WLAN external antenna, please disable the current WWAN antennas. The following section will guide you through how to change your internal/external antenna.

External Antennas

1. WLAN module card is under the WWAN module. Please take out the WWAN module, and you will see the WLAN module.
2. Locate the antenna cables. (black cable & grey cable)
3. Use the black antenna cable to connect to the connector labeled **MAIN**. Use the grey antenna cable to connect to the connector labeled **AUX**.



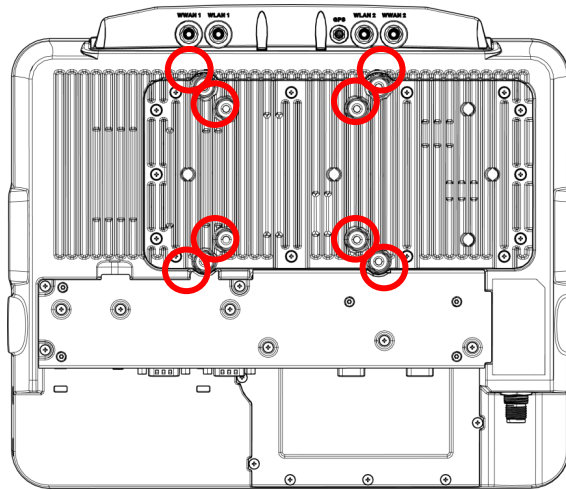
Installing/Removing Antenna Box

VX-601's antenna box can be removed and installed by manually removing the 8 screws located on the side of the antenna box. If you want to manually adjust the WWAN/WLAN antenna cable, please follow the instructions below:

1. Carefully remove the antenna box
(Note: do not pull the antenna box or you may damage the cable).
2. Manually install or remove the antenna cable or SMA to suit your working needs.

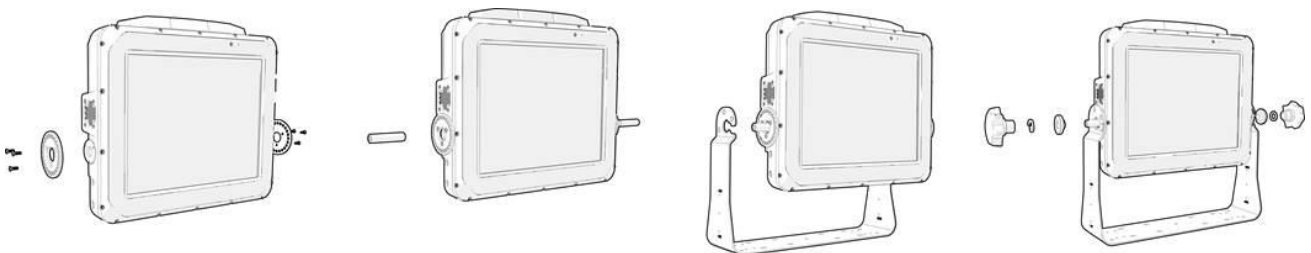
Chapter 3. Hardware Mounting

The VX-601 supports a standard VESA version MIS-D, 75/100, C (75/100mm distance quadrate order, M5 thread, depth 10mm) through the four drill holes on the back side of the device.



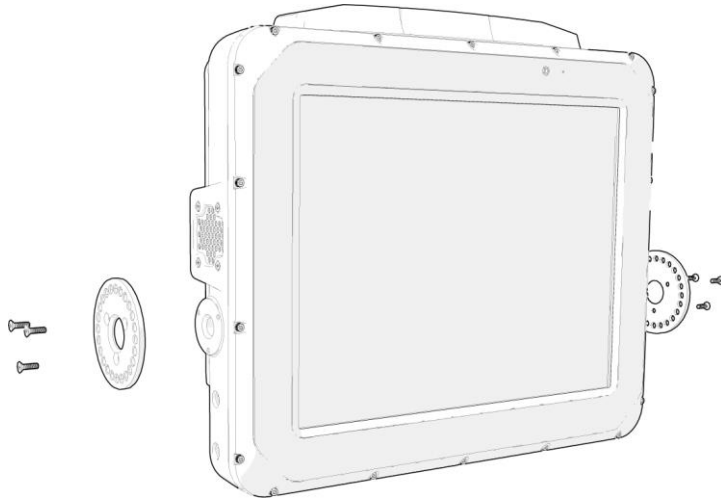

Installing U-Shape Mount

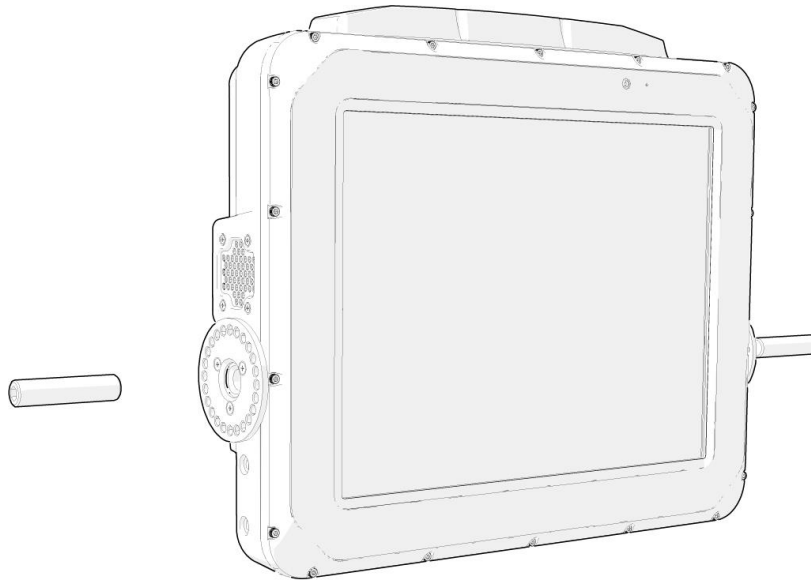


The U-shape mount is provided as an optional purchase. Please follow the steps below to install the U-shape mount.

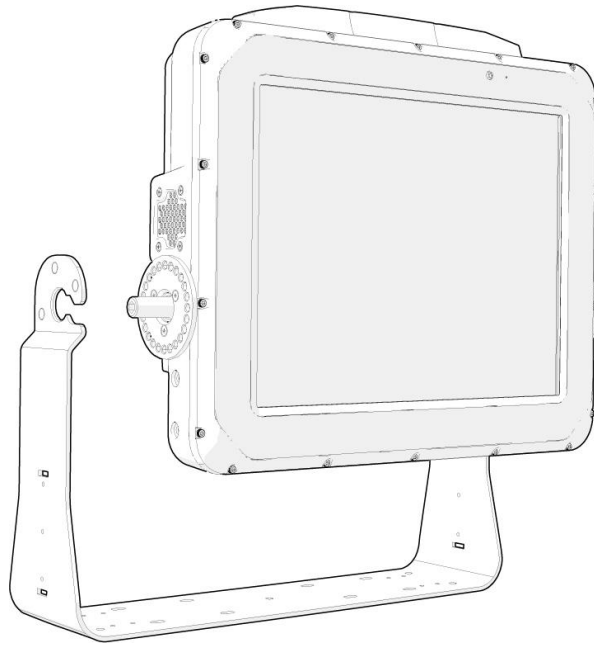
1. Place the following wheel plates onto VX-601 and lock them with three screws on each side.



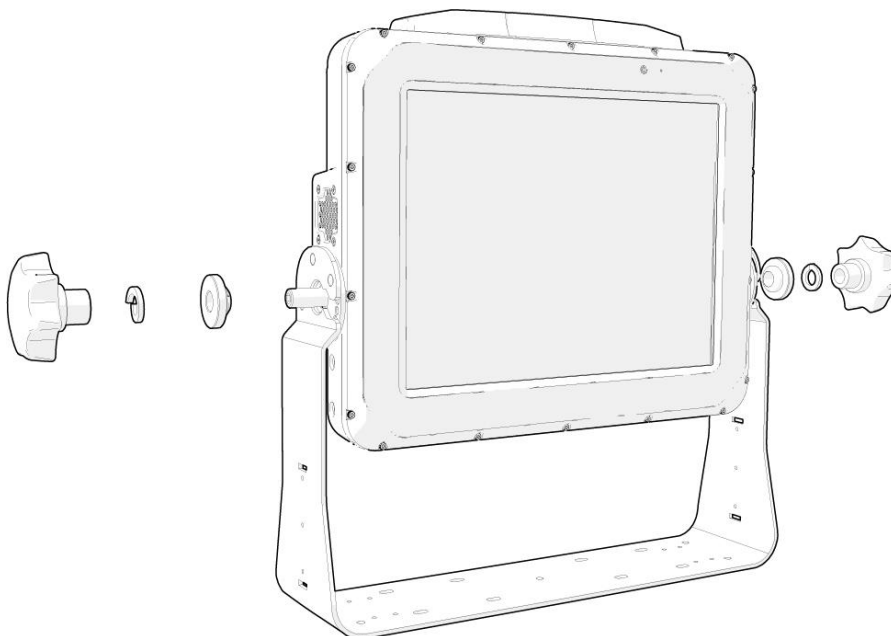
2. Use a hex key and tighten the hex lock into both sides of VX-601 threads.



3. Secure the hex lock on the U-shape mount frame using a 6 millimeter hex wrench.



4. Insert the plain washer and spring lock washer, and then tighten knobs on both sides accordingly.
5. To adjust the angles of VX-601, untighten the knobs.

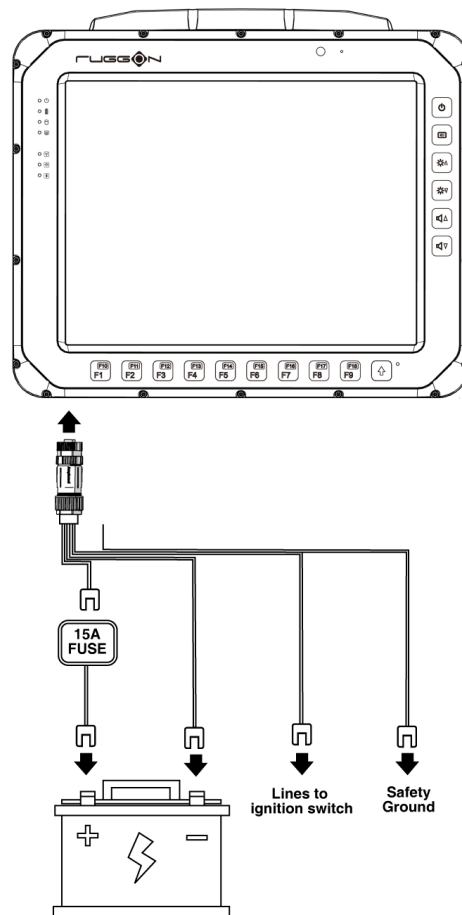
Powering the System



Make sure that all the power supplies are disconnected when you plug the power cord into the power connector.

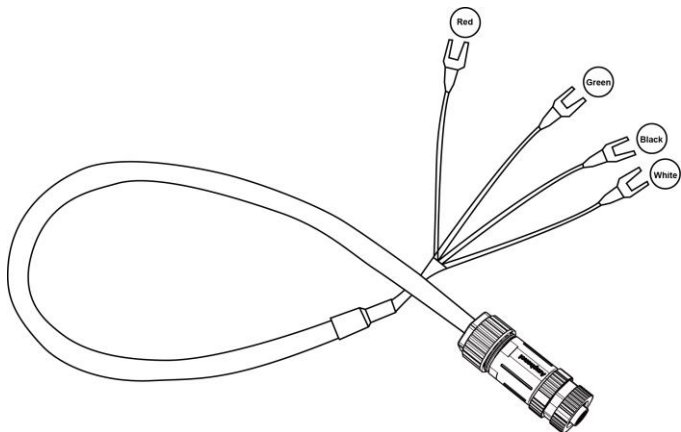
Fuses 15A are required in connecting the power cable and battery in series to avoid the risks of wire damage and vehicle burning.

Please refer to the diagram below for VX-601 installation.



Connector Power

VX-601 allows a wide range of DC power input from 9~60V via a 4-pin circular power cord. There are two options to start up the VX-601 via car power cable or external power adapter. Here is the 4-pin circular power cord.

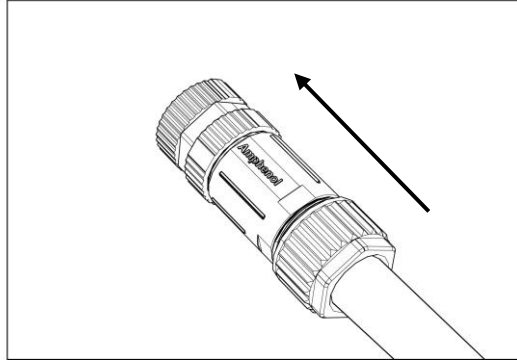

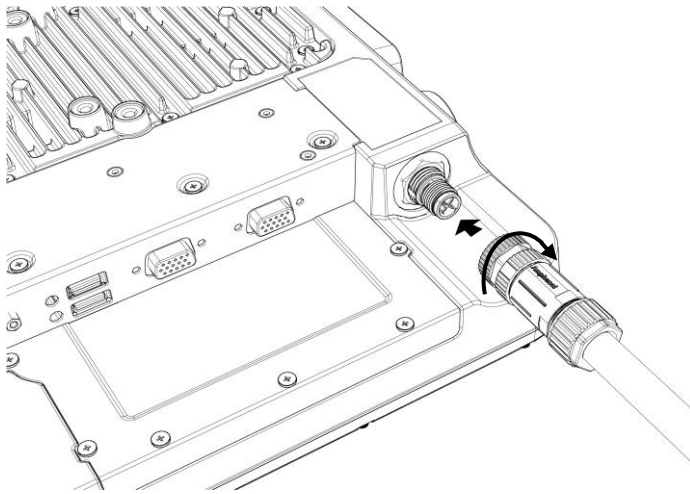

Power source from car power cable

1. The bare wire lead cable allows you to directly wire 12 V, 24 V, 36V and 48V power cable or adapters. Please follow the wire definition to connect to your power source.
2. Plug the power code into the power connector facing the top of the arrow mark.



3. Twist the nut to lock the power connector to the device.



Power source from external power adapter

If your power source is from external power adapter, your power source will not be controlled by AAC/ignition signal. Please short red (V+) and white (ACC/ Ignition) wires.

Power on the System

VX-601 has two power modes for user preference which can be activated through DashON.

If you want to use power source via power adapter, please disable “ACC Input Detection”.

To turn on the system, please follow the directions below:

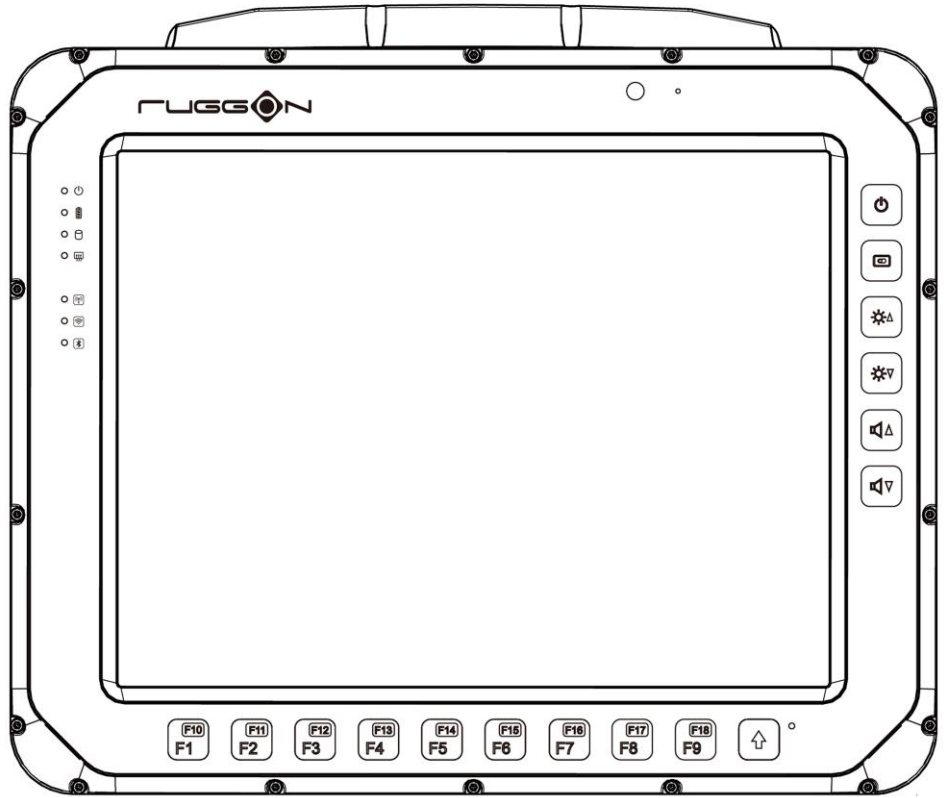
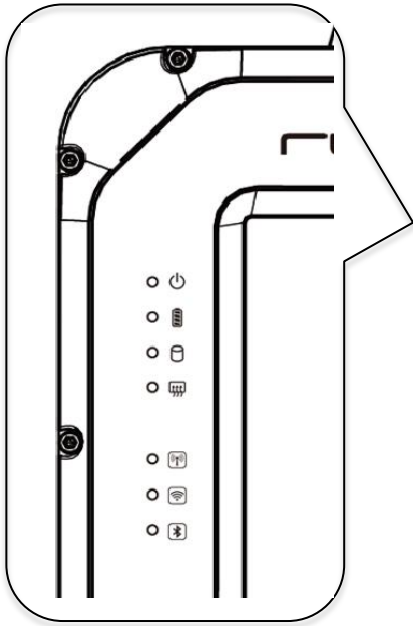
1. Press power button to turn on the system

2. When VX-601 is in “Non-ACC mode” (*Default is Non-ACC mode), the device will not auto power off when the power supply is removed (charged from UPS battery instead), please use windows command to fully shut down the device.
3. When VX-601 is in “ACC Sense Mode”, please follow the directions below:
 - When the system is off, switch the ignition from off to on, the system will turned on/delay on.
 - When the system is off and the ignition is off, press the power button, the system will be turned on/no delay on.
 - When System is off and the ignition is on, press the power button, the system will be turned on/no delay on.

LED Status



The LEDs on VX-601 are status indicators that show the operating status of your system. The status indicators can help pinpoint possible failed hardware components causing specific symptoms. Refer to the description below.

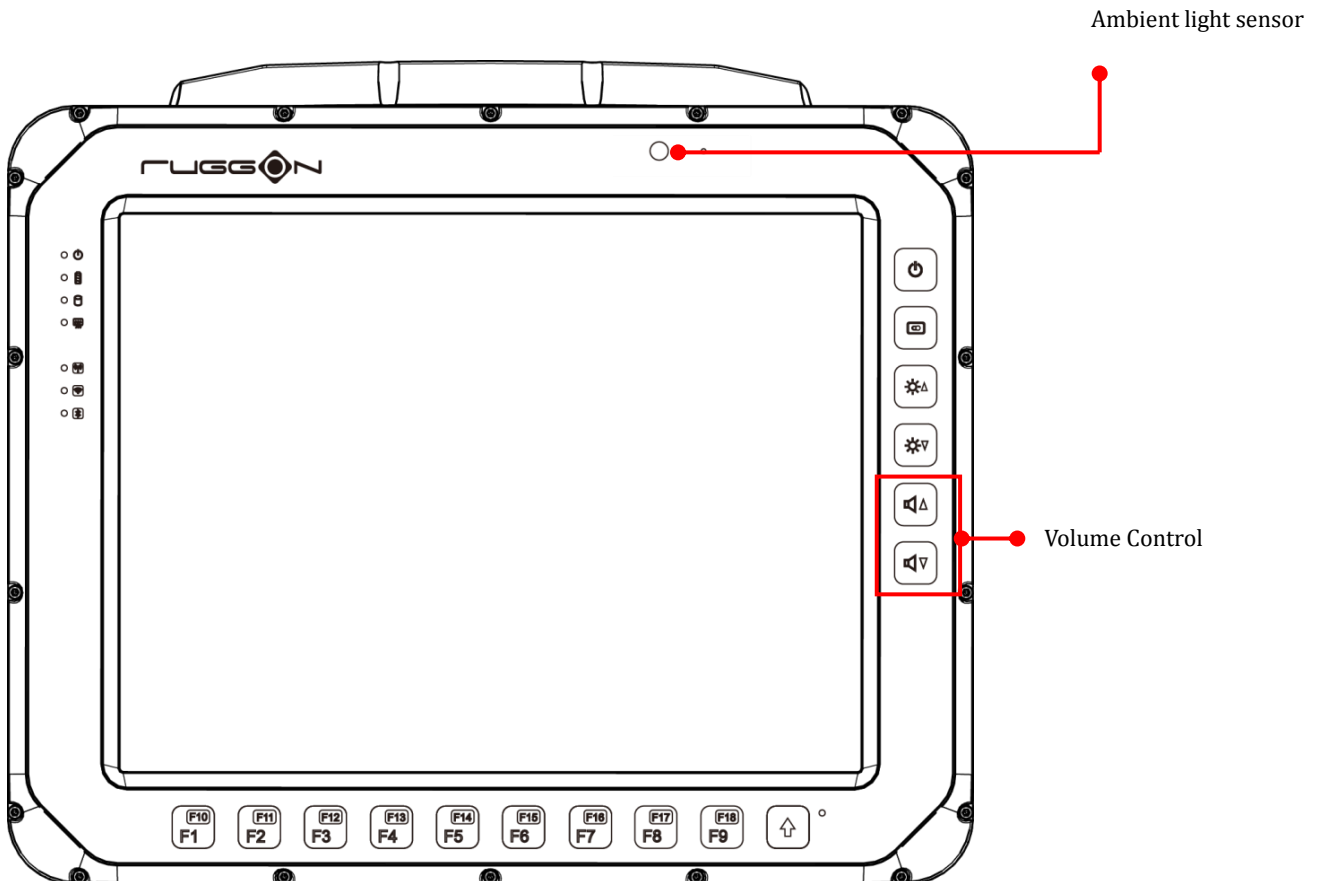

Adjust the Speaker Volume

VX-601 provides the volume control buttons to adjust the speakers' volume; you can also control the overall level of sound using Windows. When you press the top part of the volume button, it makes the volume louder; pressing the bottom part makes the volume lower

- Press the  button to increase the volume.
- Press the  button to decrease the volume.





Auto-Brightness Adjustment

When you use VX-601, you may well encounter different lighting conditions that make it difficult to see the information on screen. VX-601's built-in the ambient light sensor on the front panel supports auto-dimming, which you can also disable to manually adjust the brightness; this setting can be done via DashON.

Manual Brightness Adjustment

VX-601 also supports manual brightness adjustment; you can manually adjust the

brightness by pressing the  or  button.

Internal Microphone

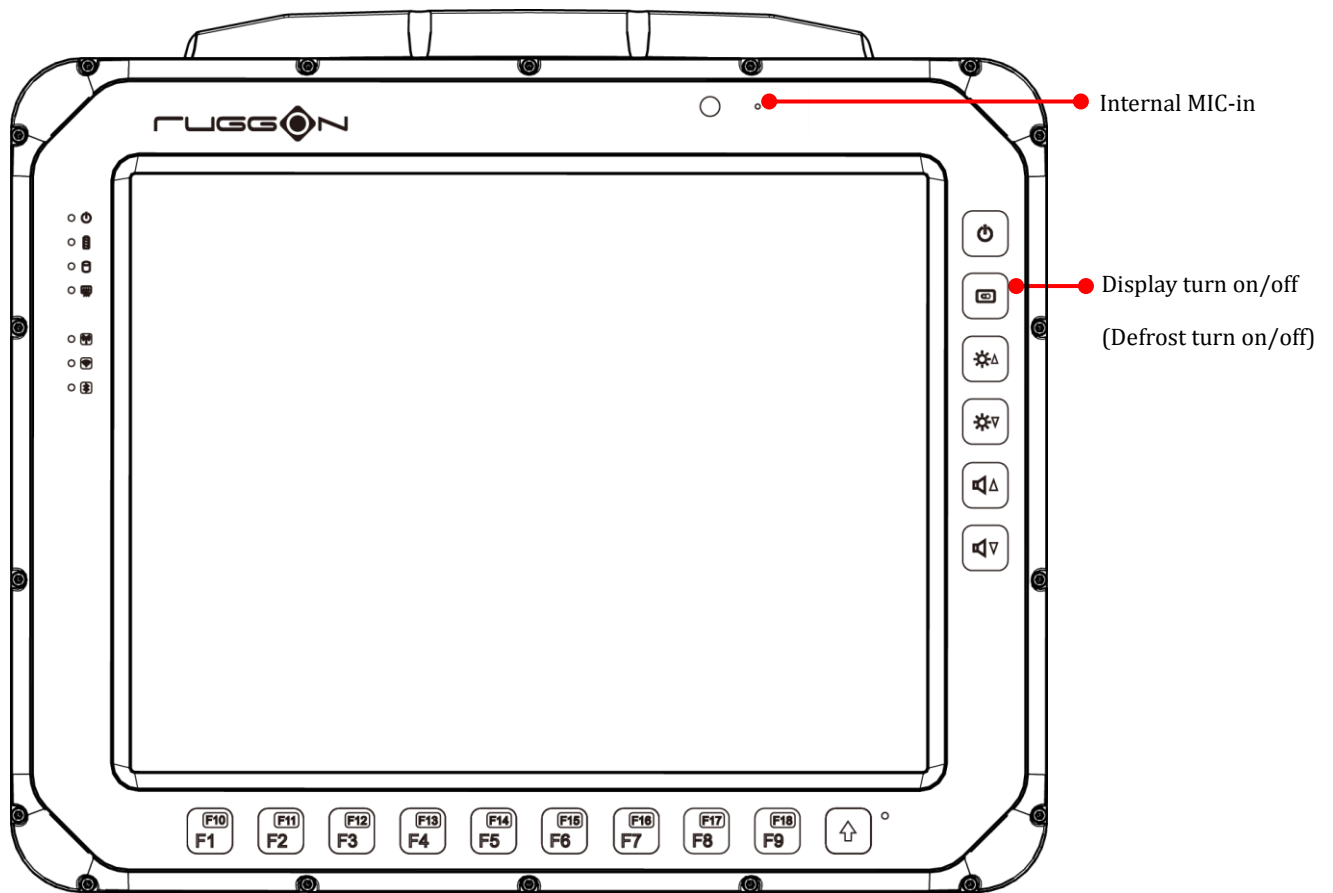
VX-601 is equipped with an internal microphone, so you don't need an external one. In addition to the built-in speaker and microphones, you can plug external headsets in the audio jack.

Display on/off

To turn on/off the display, press the display button located on the right side of the terminal.

Defrost on/off (only available upon request)

In environments where an extreme temperature change occurs, the display can frost/fog up due to such a temperature change. To enable the defrost function, press and hold the display button for 3 seconds to turn on /off the function (NOTE: the defrost function is only available upon request). The device can heat up to maximum 35 degrees Celsius. Once the device is at 35 degrees Celsius, the function will automatically shut off. (NOTE: once the device reaches 35 degrees Celsius, the function will automatically shut off. Pressing the defrost key does not re-enable the function.)



Programmable Buttons

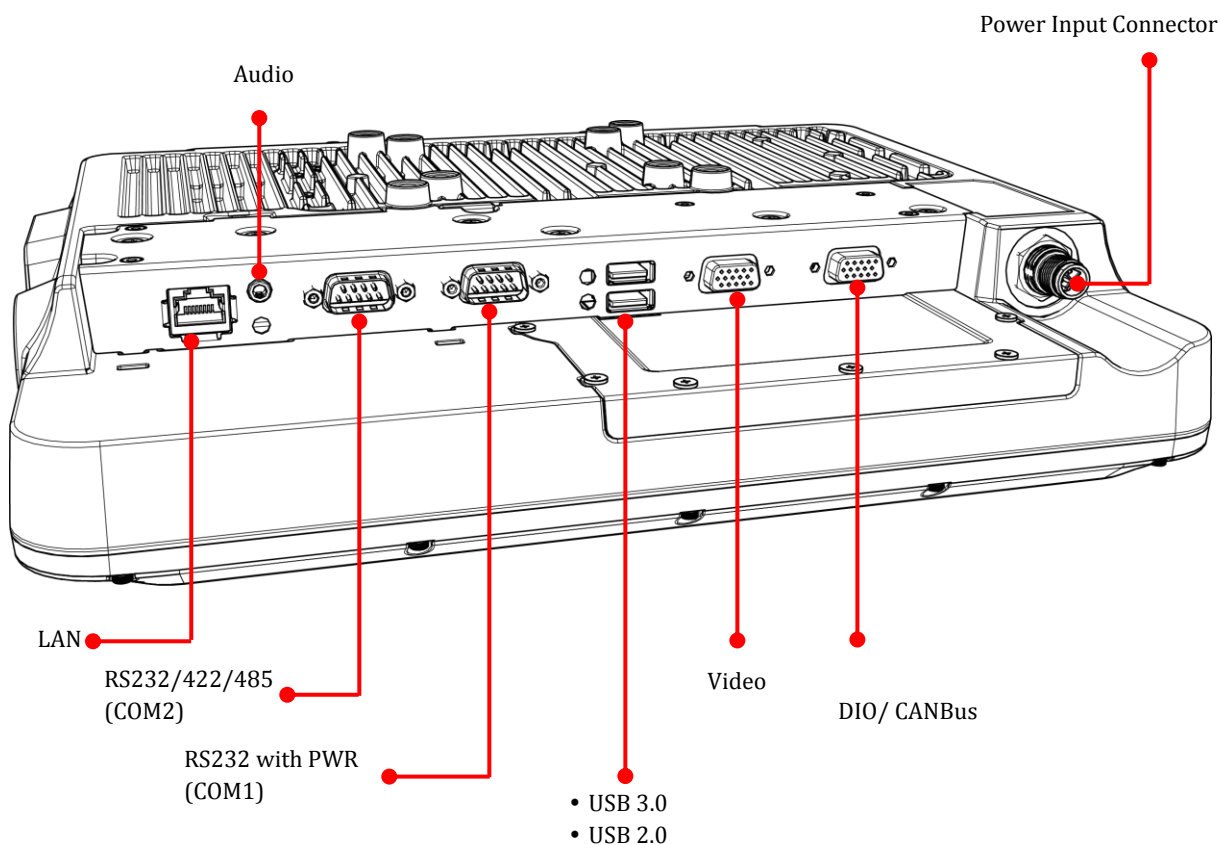
VX-601 provides default commands for nine programmable buttons. You can configure the programmable buttons via DashON to different commands or keyboard shortcuts to better fit your work style.

Chapter 7. DashON Setting

You can use DashON to configure the device for your demo or test. We also provide the corresponding SDK for your application development. DashON will auto-run in background while the system turns on. This section is to brief you on what functions are included in DashON and how to set up based on Windows OS.

1. Device Information

It provides information of the system hardware, software, and firmware version.

2. Vehicle Status

This section is to demo how to read the vehicle information such as vehicle battery voltage, fuel, speed and so on while connecting with vehicle SAE J1939. We use a simulator to run the demo.

3. Communication Setting

This is to enable / disable Wi-Fi/BT/WWAN and configure the related setting.

4. System Status & Setting

This section contains the major configuration of the system device. Power management, wake up event, IO configuration, brightness and watchdog timer setting are included.

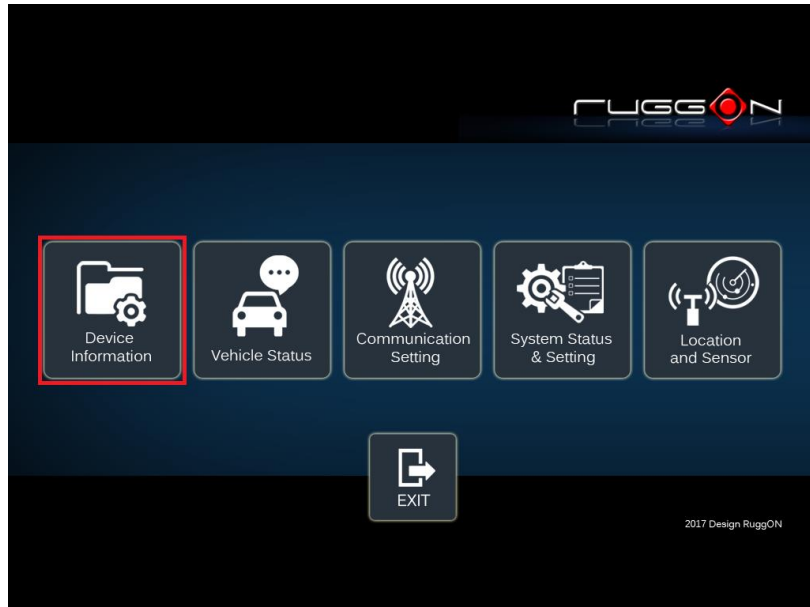
5. Location & Sensor

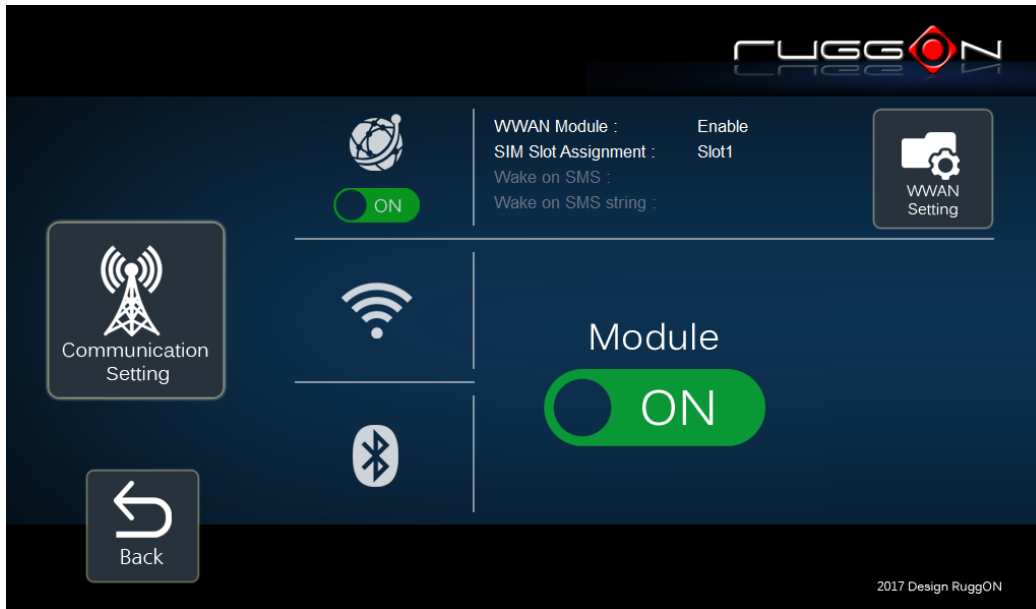
Enable/ Disable Module

Item 1. Click on the switch bar to **Enable/ Disable** Wi-Fi and Bluetooth function.



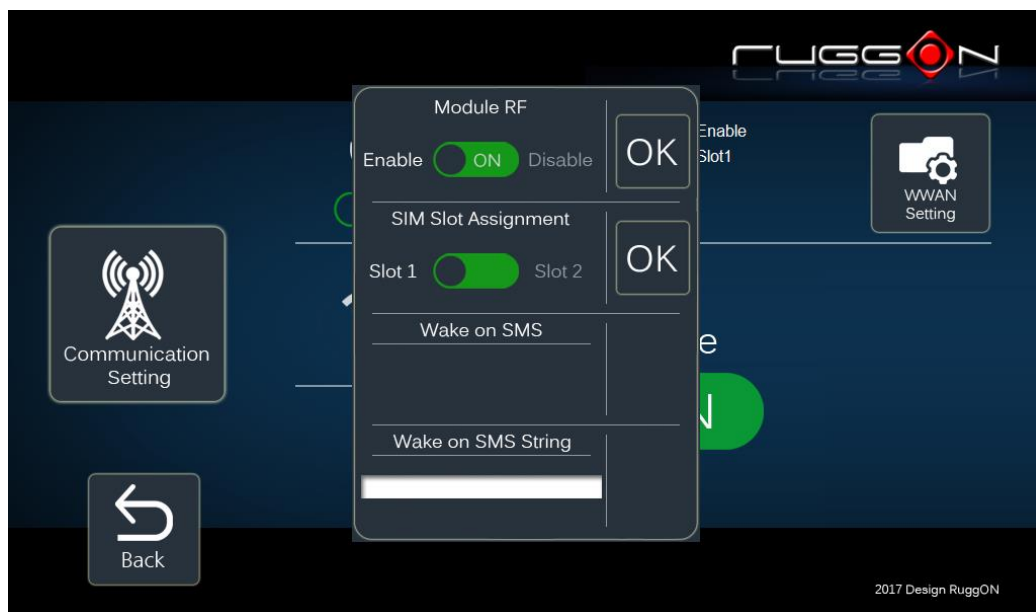
WWAN Communication Setting

2. SIM slot assignment: This feature is only available for the device with multiple SIM slots.



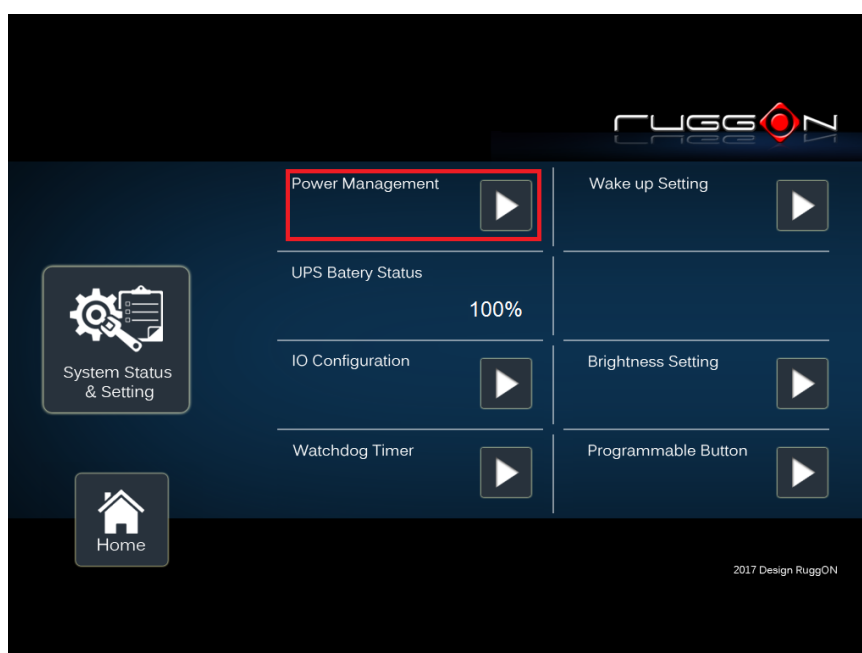

In VX-601 design setting, it supports ACC sense. You can check its status from ACC status. Default is non-ACC mode.

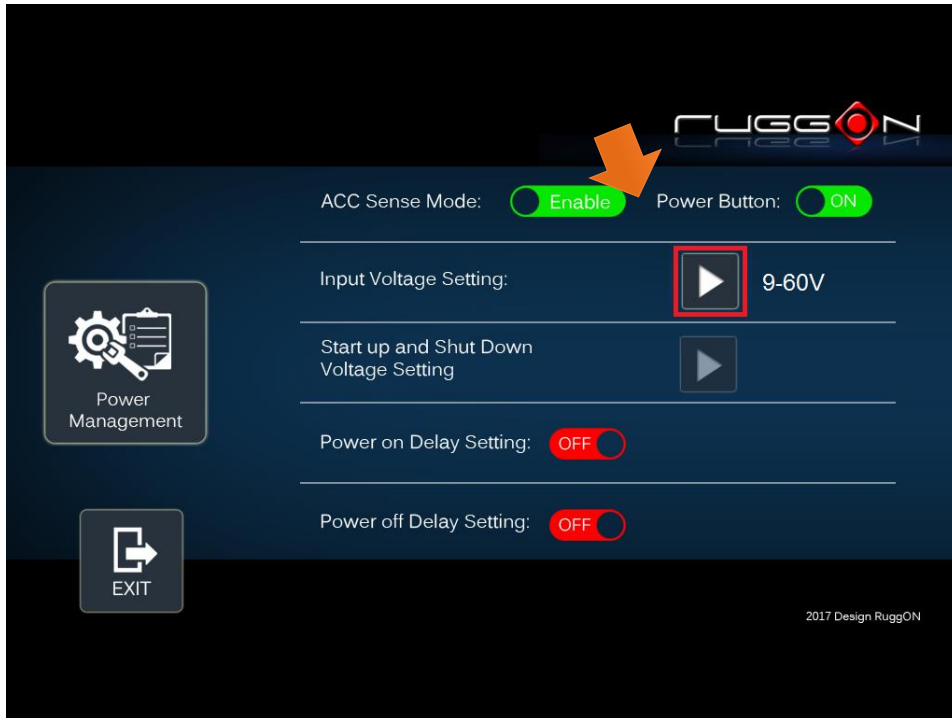


Input Voltage Setting

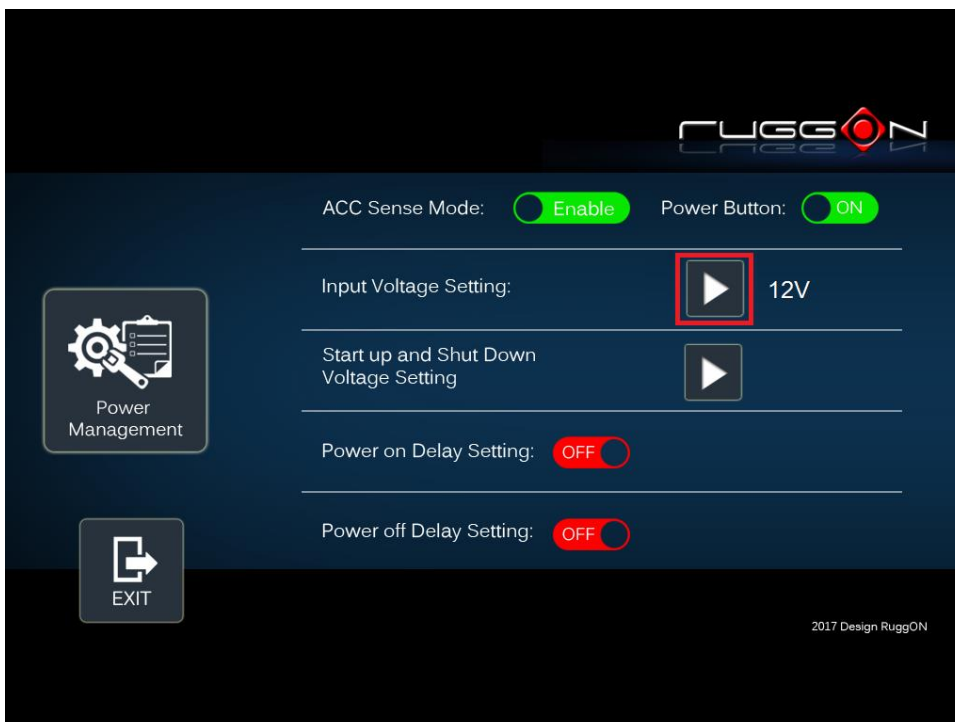
Click on the  to the input voltage selection.

You can select the power input voltage either 9~60V or 12V, 24V, 36V or 48V. If 9~60V is selected, it means the system can be powered on while the voltage ranges from 9~60V.

Please note if you use a 19V power adapter, the input voltage must be selected to 9~60V.



If 12V, 24V, 36V or 48V is selected, you can also select the startup and shut down voltage setting.





If the above selection items do not meet your demand, please contact local sales representatives.

Power On/Off Delay Setting

Power on delay function enables you to power on the device after the ACC is on for a specified period of time. Enabled power off delay function lets the device remain on until the ACC is off for a specified period of time.

Power On Delay

You can set the system startup time after ACC is on.

Switch the  to , click on the , and you will see the selection list. Delay time can be set at 10sec/30sec/1min/5min/10min/30min/60min/6hr

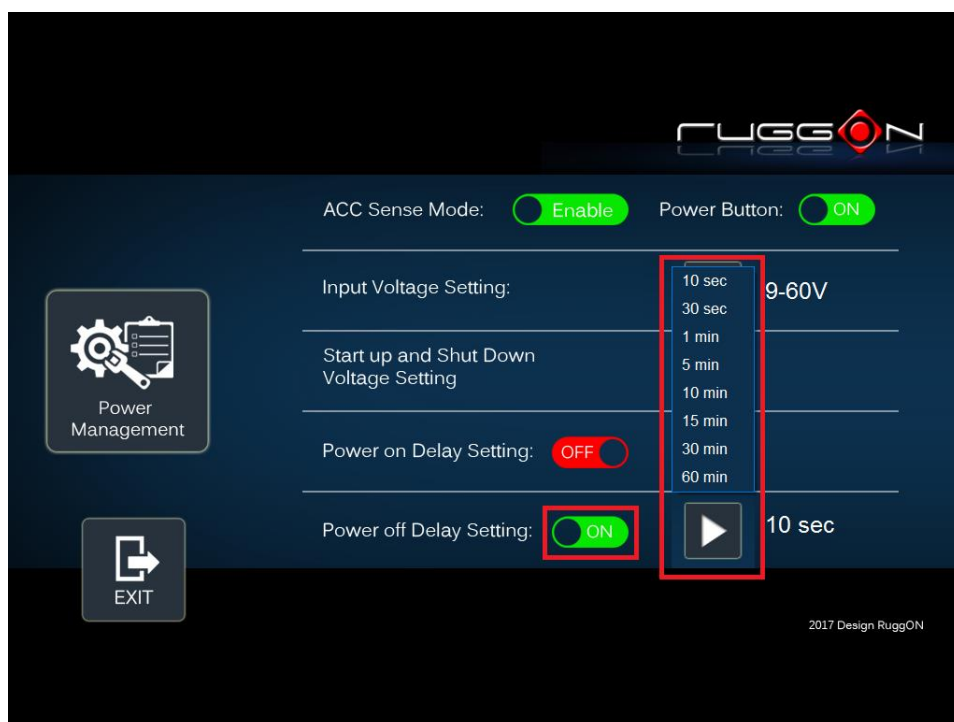


Power Off Delay

Delay time can be set at 10sec/30sec/1min/5min/10min/15min/30min/60min

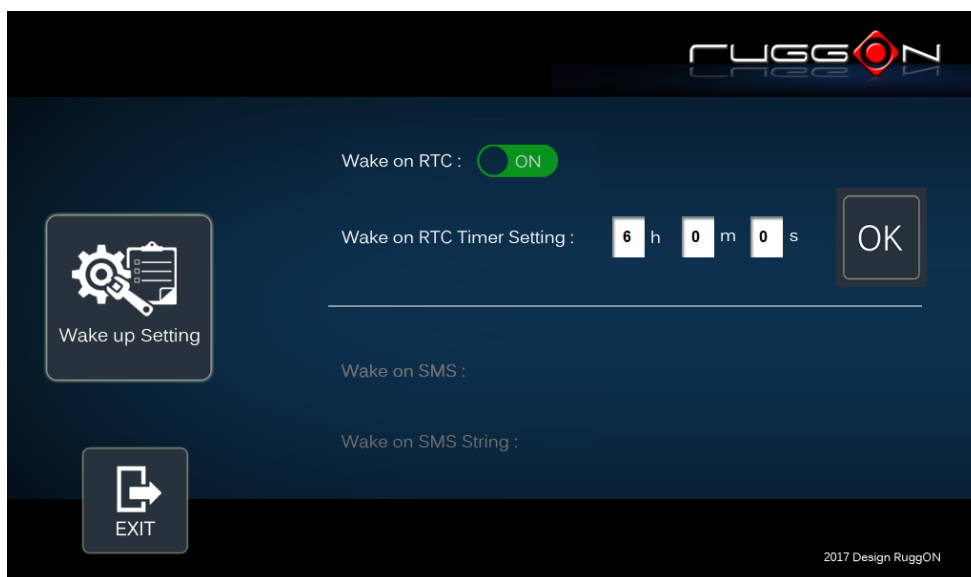
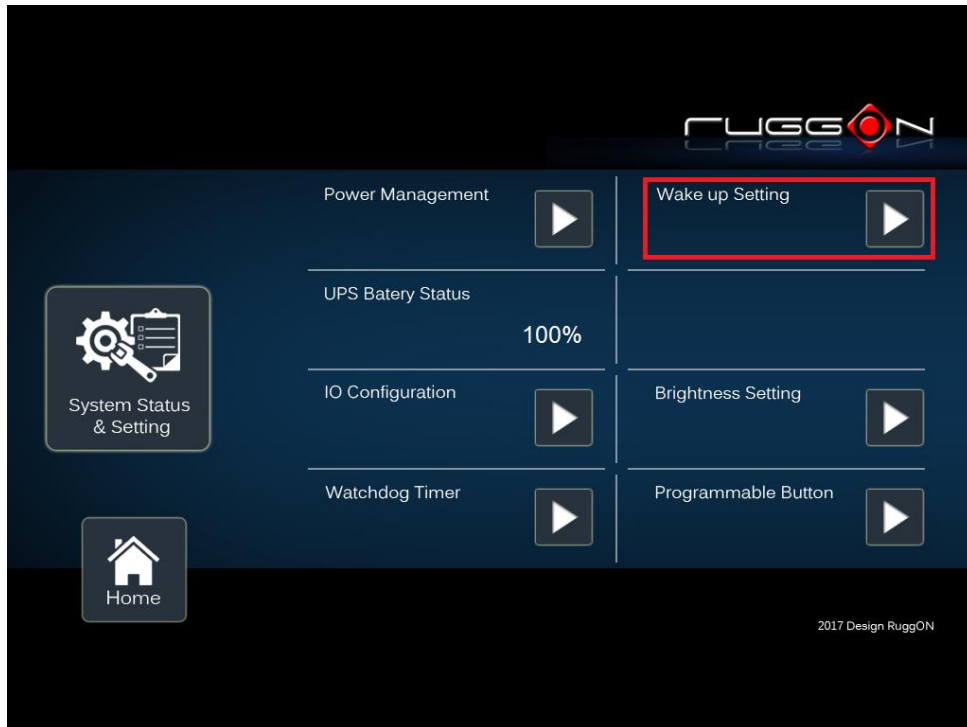


Wake up Setting



In addition to ACC sense, two wake-up events are able to power up the device. They belong to RTC wake up. Here is the setting method.

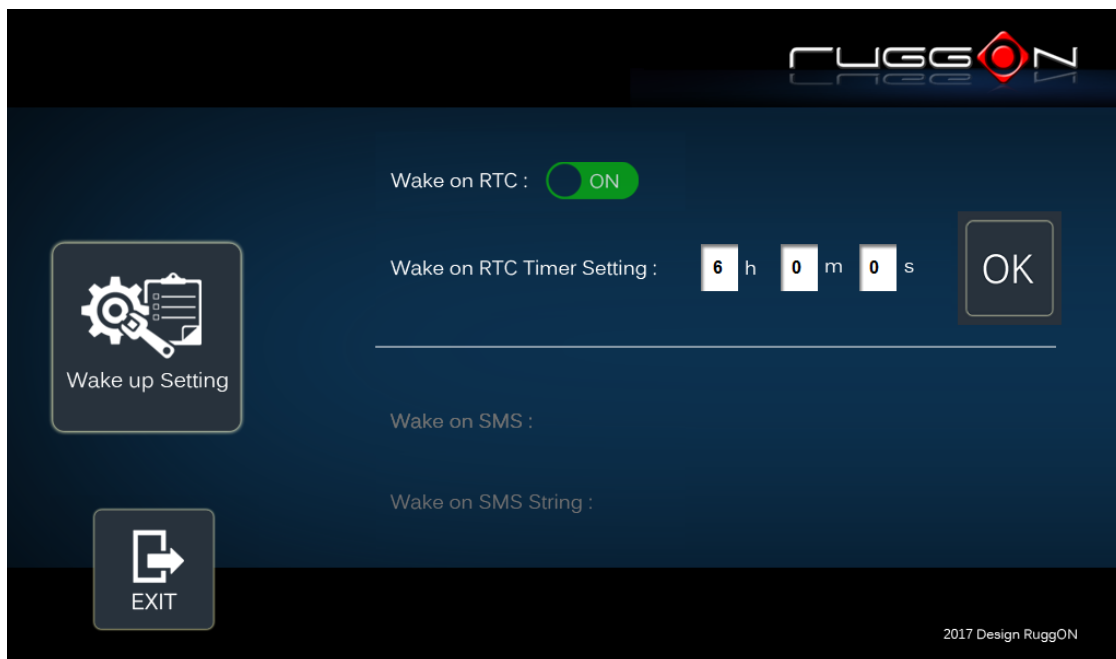

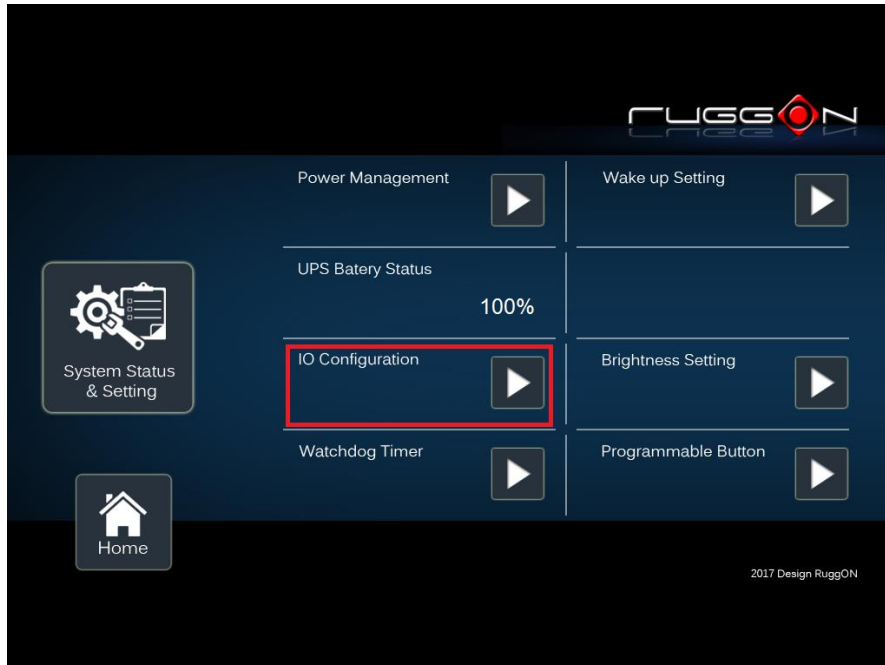

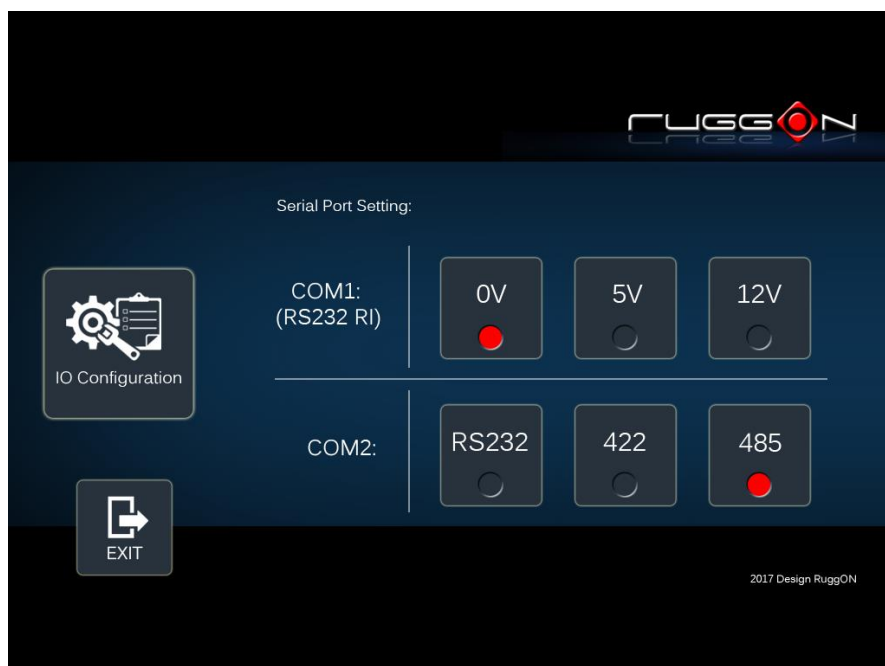

RS232 (COM1) supports 5V or 12V power output for users to easily connect with barcode scanner or other equipment. The maximum current is up to 600mA.



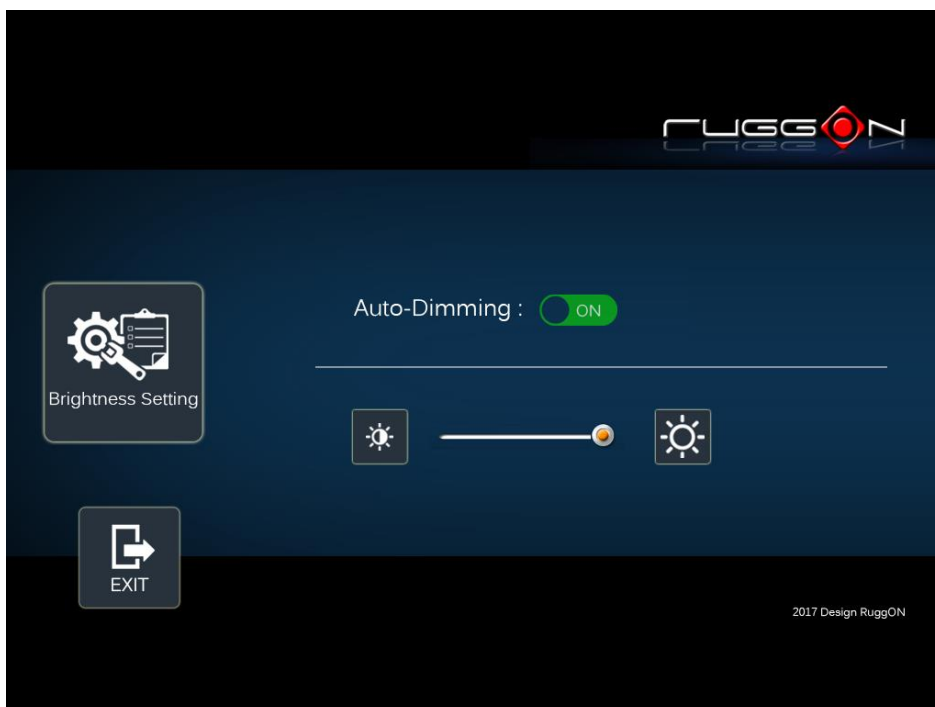

Brightness Setting

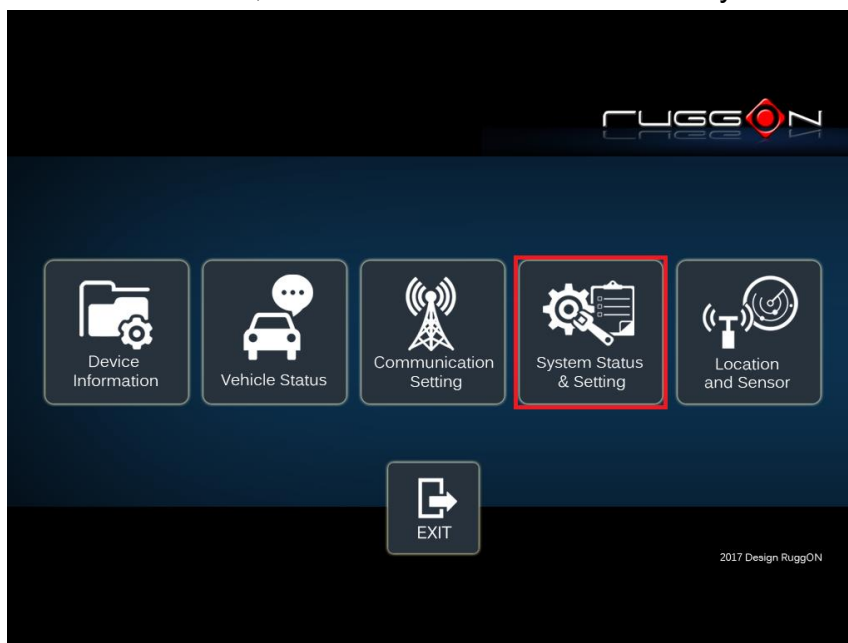
Brightness adjustment is to optimize the operation of the backlight LEDs under a variety of daylight conditions. VX-601 supports auto-dimming and manually adjusts the brightness. If auto-dimming is enabled, the brightness is auto adjusted along with the changes of environmental light. You can also manually change the display brightness via programmable buttons or the bar adjustment in DashON. For programmable button setting, please see "Programmable Button" section. VX-601's display brightness is set to automatic adjustment. You can also turn off "Auto-Dimming" and drag the scroll bar to adjust display brightness.



Watchdog Timer

This section is about the timer setting of watchdog and the simulation of watchdog functions. When the system is hanging due to some reasons, you are able to reboot the system automatically after the set time frame.

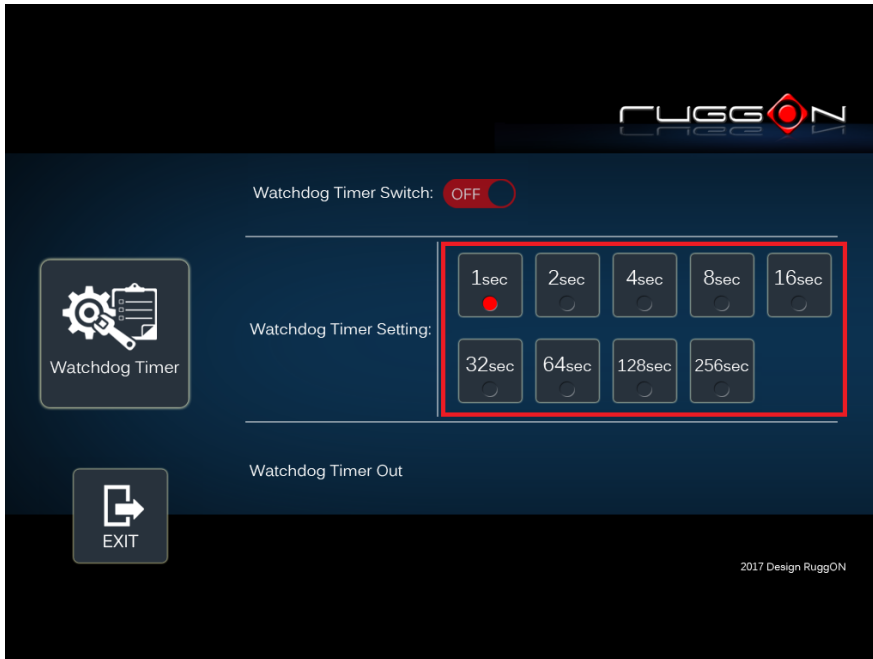

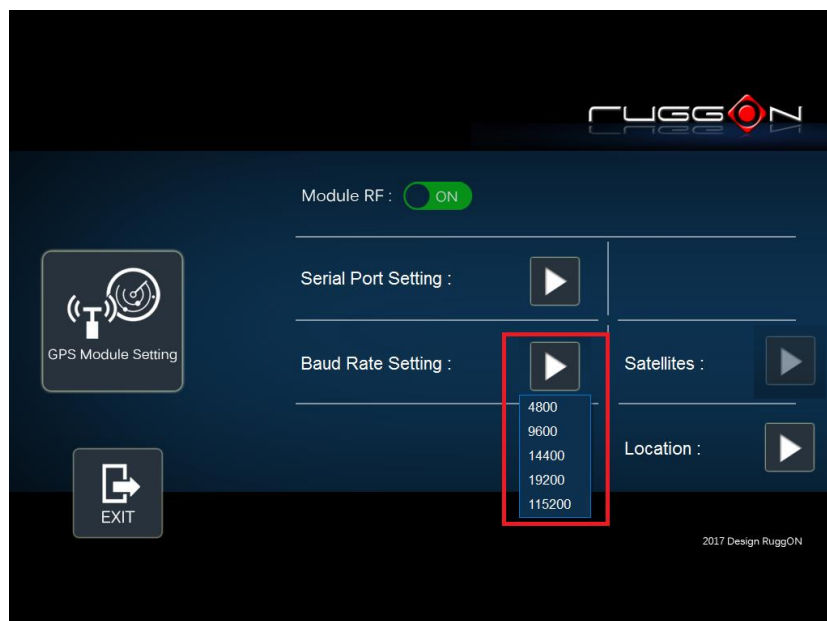
Serial Port Setting

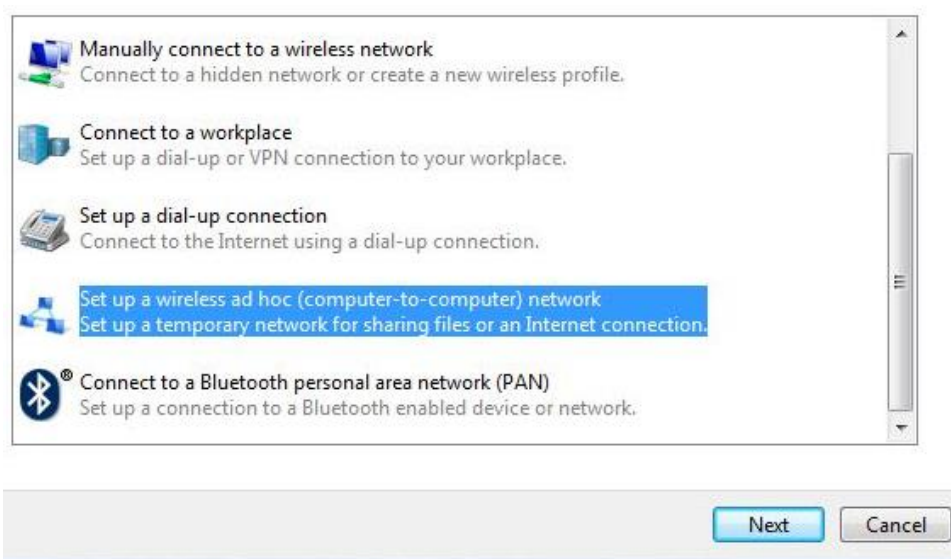
Chapter 9. Wi-Fi Hotspot Setup

VX-601 can be a gateway role for other devices to connect to the Internet. Windows has ways to create Wi-Fi hotspot, and the feature is integrated into “Network and Sharing Center”. Here is how to turn your Windows 7 into a Wi-Fi hotspot. (The process should be similar for Windows 8)

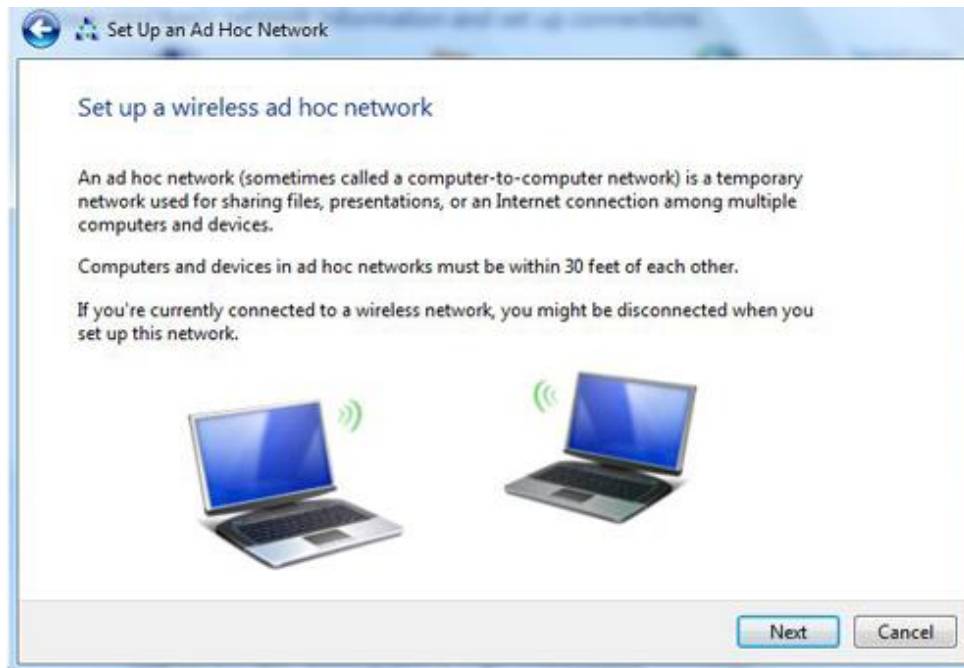
1. WWAN or LAN connection is properly connected to the Internet.
2. Make sure the Wi-Fi function is enabled (set WLAN to disabled by DashON), that isn't currently connected.
3. Go to the “Control Panel” and look for “Network and Sharing Center” and then go to “set up a new connection or network”



4. Select “Set up a wireless ad hoc (computer-to-computer) network” and click on “Next”



5. Click on "Next"



6. Enter the Network Name, choose a security type and enter the security key. Check the "Save this network" checkbox; it will save your network name on the Wireless network connection, and then click on "Next".



7. At this point your ad hoc network should be running and ready to start connecting your device. Click on the "Next".
